Water Pressure Reminder

Within the last couple of years, the West Travis County Public Utility Agency (WTCPUA) increased their flow pressure to meet increasing growth in our area. Because of this, some homes are experiencing extremely high pressure (over 100 PSI) in their homes, damaging appliances and fixtures. To avoid this, have a plumber check to see if there is a pressure regulator at the water connection to the house. Many older homes in our area do not have these.

Hays County does not have any brush removal scheme in place, so all brush piled along the edges of the road will remain there until removed by the homeowner. We encourage everyone to clear brush piles as soon as possible since they present an increased risk of fire and damage to the neighborhood.



Can we have livestock on our properties in Sunset Canyon?


Livestock restrictions vary per section and lot in Sunset Canyon. The deed restictions for each section clarify what kind of livestock are allowed, and are available to view on the Sunset Canyon website at https:// sunsetcanyon.org/documents. An overview is as follows: Sections 1-3: No swine allowed. Horses, cows, sheep and goats allowed in fenced area behind the house on certain lots only. Quantity based on lot size. Section 4: Same as above, but livestock is limited to horses only. Section 5: No livestock permitted. Only cats and dogs allowed.

TEXAS LEMON DROP

A refreshing cocktail to beat the summer heat Contributed by William Wigfield

Yield: 2 COCKTAILS

Ingredients

Juice from a meyer lemon 1 1/2 oz. Paula's Lemon 3 oz. vodka 1 oz. simple syrup

Garnish

1 T sugar Twist of lemon peel

Directions

Rub the lemon rind around the rim of two martini glasses. Spread a small plate with sugar and invert the glasses onto it, ensuring the rims are coated completely. Combine all ingredients in a cocktail shaker with several ice cubes. Shake for 20-30 seconds. Strain into prepared glasses and garnish with a twist of lemon peel.

Gardeners' Corner

Q

What are some good landscape plants that will thrive without a lot of water?

There are many native plants that thrive here even during our hot and dry summers, but choosing the best fit for your property can be overwhelming. However, over the years I've found a few favorites that come back year after year and provide beauty, food for our pollinators, and sometimes even food for us. Let's start with vines. #1 Texas Wisteria Wisteria frutescens

This native wisteria is less showy than the introduced species from Asia that you often see engulfing arbors and trellises. However, it blooms more than once per year and is overall a much better behaved plant. You can grow this along a fence or arbor with confidence, knowing that it won't collapse after a few years. Ours has been blooming beautifully for seven years with no supplemental water ever.

water ever.
#2 Maypop
Passiflora incarnata
Also called purple passionflower,
this prolific vine will happily
weather drought, heavy freezes,
and punishing heat. Known for
its habit of spreading through
underground runners, maypop dies

to the ground every winter and pops back up every spring to climb and twine around every available surface. It is a host species for the Gulf Frittilary butterfly, and produces edible fruits that turn yellow when ripe. Ours sends out runners all over the garden and adjacent areas, and our challenge is keeping it contained to where we want it! -- Sarah Wigfield
